Message from the executive



Catherine: This year, we have built vital connections with thousands of seniors thanks to your commitment. These relationships go far beyond mere contacts; they are bridges leading to a more fulfilled and less isolated life. People like M. Plouffe and Mme Bertrand were particularly touched by your kindness and through you, have found a new family. As M. Plouffe said: "Thanks to you, I no longer feel alone. Your support has changed my life."



Paul: With **15 local teams** and their dedicated staff spread across **12 regions in Québec**, we consolidated our presence by supporting approximately **2,750 seniors** in 2023–2024, a **2.4%** increase over the previous year. This year, nearly **3,000 volunteers** generously dedicated **200,000** hours of their time to breaking isolation and creating meaningful human relationships.

Your generosity has been exceptional, with **donations totalling \$4,005,278** and revenues of **1.1 million dollars** generated through our two charitable boutiques. Each gift, each piece of clothing or object donated, and each hour of volunteering, has made it possible to provide a strong and constant network of support and companionship for our Great Friends. Mme Bertrand added that "the activities organized by Little Brothers are a breath of fresh air."





Catherine Harel-Bourdon's arrival at the head of our organization on August 21, 2023, marked the beginning of a new era. She brought together a strong leadership team and is currently working on a five-year strategic plan which will be unveiled during the winter of 2025. We have listened to your suggestions and are ready to put them in action.

Supporting our aging population is more crucial than ever. Québec is experiencing a rapid increase in population of people aged 65 and over and the proportion of those over 85 could almost quadruple by 2066. We need to act now to create an environment where every senior feels valued and socially connected. These ties are essential, and each of one of us can contribute to strengthening them.





Your dedication to creating a caring future for seniors is precious, and we acknowledge that you are making an invaluable gift to our society. Nonetheless, the ongoing search for funding and donations remains essential to ensuring the sustainability and growth of our organization. To meet this challenge, we need to diversify and increase our sources of funding, attract new donors, and strengthen partnerships with family businesses and foundations.

Media coverage and community support have strengthened our credibility in the fight against loneliness and isolation among people aged 75 and over in Québec. Through our combined efforts, we have been able to raise awareness regarding the reality of senior's isolation and bring generations closer together.




Changes to the Near You Program

The Near You Program (formerly Friendly Voice Program) provided seniors with phone calls that brightened their lives and were a lifeline during the COVID-19 pandemic. However, with changing post-pandemic needs, the President and CEO, with the support of the board of directors, has decided to change the focus of this program. In person meetings and support have generally replaced phone calls. However, we continue to maintain and encourage friendship calls for seniors who can benefit from this free and simple service.

Good news regarding our house and head office on Garnier Street

We are pleased to announce that, contrary to the information published in August 2021, Little Brothers has decided to keep its house on Garnier Street. We had initially stated that the house would be sold, due to staff working remotely and the decrease in onsite activities. Renovation work is underway, including repairs to the roof and balconies as well as painting and refurbishing the reception room. As the gathering place and home base for our community since 1968, this space will continue to remain at the heart of our activities and our heritage.



Each senior received a Little Brothers blanket to stay warm during the winter and those who could not make the outing received a home visit.

The extensive media coverage also highlighted the importance of these events, emphasizing their positive impact on the well-being of seniors, who, without Little Brothers, would have been alone during the holidays.

For elderly persons who are often alone, this holiday is much more than just a break: it is a real opportunity for them to recharge their batteries, rekindle a sense of belonging and escape the monotony of everyday life. Mme Dion was delighted with her stay and expressed her happiness: "It was fantastic, we were pampered. We participated in activities and picnics. It was a wonderful experience."

This summer, **220 Great Friends** enjoyed extended stays, while **290 more** participated in cheerful sunny picnics. In all, more than **500 seniors** had a joyful and meaningful experience. A change of environment allows seniors to fully immerse themselves in nature and offers them a few moments of relaxation and serenity in a peaceful setting.



Partnerships and subsidized projects

Caring for seniors requires the commitment of an entire community. We are fortunate to be able to count on your support, as well as that of organizations, partners and government bodies dedicated to the cause of seniors. We **thank them** for their valuable commitment to our mission:

SOS Aînés Maltraitance (SOSAM): This organization intervenes in cases of abuse, offering support and advice to coordinators, Great Friends and volunteers, whether by phone or in person.

VIEsÂGE: This educational platform provides our coordinators with a wide range of conferences on aging, addressing key themes such as depression, anxiety and sleep.

Municipalités amies des aînés (MADA) Program: This program allows us to train specialized volunteers to accompany our Great Friends to health facilities, while responding to their complex needs.

Québec ami des aînés (QADA) Program: This program supports our initiatives to innovate and improve the quality of life of the seniors we care for in Québec.

Age Well at Home Program: This Government of Canada program reinforces our efforts to help our Great Friends stay at home while improving their well-being.

New Horizons for Seniors (NHSP) Program: Launching a project with Carrefour 50+ in Rimouski has allowed us to create new volunteer groups to fight the isolation of seniors in remote and rural areas.

Soutien aux organismes communautaires Program (PSOC): This program supports the overall mission of Little Brothers and recognizes its essential contribution to improving the health and well-being of seniors.

Volunteer Support Program (SAB): This program enables elected members of the National Assembly to support the activities of Little Brothers to promote volunteerism in their communities.



Actions to raise awareness of social isolation ———

Salon des aînés de Saint-Jérôme

In September 2023, during the 6th edition of the **Salon des aînés de Saint-Jérôme**, we had the honour of celebrating an iconic figure, **Béatrice Picard**, who has been the Little Brothers' ambassador since 2007. In recognition of her 75-year-long career and exceptional commitment, she received a bouquet of 75 roses and was paid a heartfelt tribute before an audience of 200 guests. The **Luc Maurice Foundation** made a **\$4,000** donation to the Little Brothers Foundation, a concrete gesture to support the fight against the social isolation of seniors.

Solidarity March on October 1st

On October 1, 2023, on the occasion of the International Day of Older Persons, nearly **800 people** mobilized to walk in Montréal and Québec City in support of seniors' well-being. Headed by the **Mouvement HABITATS** team from **Un et un font mille**, this initiative brought together committed people focused on "Acting together for the well-being of seniors." Our Great Friend **Maria Luisa**, who was walking with a group from Little Brothers, reminded us that "we must see our elders as a living heritage and offer them the opportunity to share their valuable knowledge."





A national meeting on homecare

On May 8, 2024, at the Rendez-vous national sur le maintien à domicile organized by the Coalition pour la dignité des aînés (CDA) in Québec City, we reaffirmed the need for close collaboration between the public and community sectors in the face of our aging demographic. Discussions focused on key topics such as prevention, home support, access to housing, and the fight against isolation, to ensure the autonomy and dignity of our Great Friends.

Participation in the 4th Forum sur la gériatrie sociale

On May 14, 2024, at the 4th Forum sur la gériatrie sociale, "Agir pour bien vieillir," participants had the opportunity to learn more about the factors that can influence aging and to reflect, alongside specialists from several disciplines, on how each of us can reduce the barriers and challenges related to aging. Little Brothers explored promising avenues for prevention, forged new ties with allies in the health sector, and discussed respecting end-of-life choices. Thank you to **Fondation ÂGES** for initiating these crucial discussions on improving the quality of life for our Great Friends.





Launch of "La fierté de vieillir" Action Plan

On May 31, 2024, in Québec City, we participated in a major event bringing together 375 participants, including several seniors' organizations, ministers, and committed partners. Sonia Bélanger, Minister Responsible for Seniors and Minister for Health, unveiled an ambitious vision for the aging population resulting of an unprecedented consultation between 34 departments and agencies. Fighting isolation, agism and strengthening home care were on the agenda. Supporting community organizations, such as Little Brothers, as well as their volunteers, will be crucial to realizing the vision that Québec is a place where one can age with dignity.



- Getting involved with the charitable boutiques in Plateau Mont-Royal



Companionship

Importance of community volunteering

This year, **over 60%** of our Great Friends were paired with a volunteer. It's a significant number, but one we aspire to surpass. Your commitment is essential to achieving this goal and meeting the increasingly complex psychological, mental and social needs of the seniors we support.

According to an internal survey conducted in the spring of 2024 among **280 Great Friends**, it appears that **regular visits from the same volunteer play an essential role in breaking their isolation and loneliness**. This reinforces our determination to recruit volunteers who are willing to make a long-term commitment. We onboard them with the appropriate training, support and tools to make their experience both fulfilling and rewarding.





Training and innovations for volunteering

1,000 training sessions during the year

is made possible thanks to your donations, allowing volunteers to provide companionship for one or more seniors on a regular basis.



An innovative new training tool

In February 2024, we launched a new online training platform (LMS) for our volunteers, after its initial launch for our coordinators in August 2023. Since then, some **2,800 people** have signed up, including **2,700 volunteers**.

This LMS offers hands-on resources and flexible training, even over the phone, for **30% of users**. Already adopted by **90% of our coordinators**, this tool strengthens our team's skills, improves support for seniors and prepares our organization for the future.



A new system for improved volunteer coordination

In the winter of 2024, Little Brothers adopted a new customer relations management (CRM) system to improve volunteer coordination and team efficiency. This system centralizes data while ensuring the security and confidentiality of information. Ultimately, it will facilitate the organization of support activities for seniors and allow a more strategic approach to measuring our actions. The CRM also includes interactive dashboards to track activities in real time, analyze data and measure impact. By automating these processes, the system reduces processing time and facilitates the coordination of companionship activities. This solution enables more informed decisions, optimizes the support offered and prepares our organization for a more efficient and integrated future.





An emotional and bonding movie night

On March 15, 2024, a fundraiser was held at the Beaubien cinema in Montréal with the screening of Robin Aubert's film "Tu ne sauras jamais," organized with the support of **AXIA Films**. The event, dedicated to the Little Brothers Foundation, raised **more** than \$2,000 and brought together over a hundred volunteers, donors, partners and employees, all of them committed to our mission. The gathering was a typical friendly and joyful Little Brothers event.

The movie tells the story of Paul Vincent, an old man nearing the end of his life, confined to his room in a CHSLD during COVID-19. It sheds a light on the poignant reality of seniors during the confinement and reminds us of the importance of our mission in the fight against isolation.

A wave of regional generosity to fight off the heat wave

In April 2024, we launched a fundraising campaign in every region where we have a physical presence and reached out to you through letters and emails. You have been at the heart of this initiative, responding to the request to support the elderly throughout Québec.

This campaign was also an opportunity to raise the awareness of the dangers that heatwaves pose, especially for our most vulnerable elders. 


